





The portal ensures farmers have access to 172+ certificate courses tailored to their respective projects and beneficiary-oriented activities under HADP.

- Mandatory Learning Path: Farmers applying for schemes through the Kisan Sathi Portal must complete relevant courses under their chosen projects, ensuring they have the necessary skills and understanding.
- Multi-Lingual Access: The portal features content in four languages—Hindi, Urdu, Kashmiri, Dogri, and English—ensuring inclusivity and ease of learning for all farmers across the region.
- Comprehensive Course Content: Each course comes with:
 - Detailed course materials in PDF format,
 - High-quality instructional videos,
 - Demo videos showcasing 172 beneficiaryoriented activities across the 29 HADP projects.
- Easy Certification: Upon successful completion of the courses, farmers can download certificates issued by SKUAST- J/K as proof of their expertise.



Q: Can you tell us about yourself and your journey to becoming a Krishi Udyami?

Dr. Danish Bashir: I am Dr. Danish Bashir, working as a Krishi Udyami at Kisan Khidmat Ghar, Nowgham, under the Chief Agriculture Office in Lal Mandi, Srinagar. I have a Ph.D. in Fruit Science from SKUAST-Kashmir and currently reside in Bagh-i-Mehtab, Srinagar. When I came across the advertisement for Agriculture Entrepreneurs, I immediately decided to join. The required qualifications aligned with my academic background, and it offered flexibility, allowing me to stay connected with my subject while also giving time to my child, as the role allows providing services from home as well.

Q: What services does the Kisan Khidmat Ghar provide to farmers?

Dr. Danish Bashir: KKG is a one-stop solution for farmers. It offers a range of services, from selecting suitable land to marketing their produce. Farmers can avail themselves of all these services under one roof. My role involves introducing farmers to the various schemes and latest developments in the Agriculture Department.

Q: What are your key responsibilities at KKG Srinagar?

Dr. Danish Bashir: My primary role is to assist farmers with applications for schemes through the Kisan Sathi portal and other government portals, provide them with basic technical expertise, and connect them with experts for advanced guidance. Additionally, I ensure timely availability of inputs like seeds, fertilizers, and equipment at approved rates.

Q: How do you assist farmers with accessing schemes and resources?

Dr. Danish Bashir: I guide them through the Kisan Sathi portal, helping them fill out applications correctly. Many farmers are unfamiliar with digital processes, so I ensure they understand each step. Once their applications are approved, I follow up to ensure they receive the intended benefits without delays.

Q: How are you encouraging youth to take up entrepreneurship?

Dr. Danish Bashir: We are actively encouraging educated youth, including women, who are unable to find jobs to explore entrepreneurship opportunities. The government offers subsidies of up to 80 percent, which can uplift unemployed youth. Our aim is to inspire more people to become independent and take advantage of these schemes.

Q: How do you see KKG evolving in the future?

Dr. Danish Bashir: My goal is to become a successful entrepreneur myself and a job provider for other unemployed youth. I also strive to build trust between farmers, the Kisan Khidmat Ghar, and the Agriculture Department. By ensuring the sensible use of modern gadgets and technologies installed at KKG, I hope to help farmers adopt innovative practices that will lead to prosperity.

Q: What message would you like to share with farmers?*

Dr. Danish Bashir: I encourage all farmers to visit their nearest Kisan Khidmat Ghar to avail themselves of the services provided by Krishi Udyamis. Have faith in us, as we are committed to providing quality products at fair prices and offering all kinds of assistance at one stop—your Kisan Khidmat Ghar. Together, we can work towards a brighter and more prosperous future.

IV: Kisan Sampark Abhiyan & Baseline Survey: Bridging the Gaps



The Kisan Sampark Abhiyan was a remarkable initiative launched to engage and empower farmers in Jammu and Kashmir, providing them with critical information on agricultural schemes, government initiatives, and sustainable farming practices. This program, which stands as one of the largest outreach efforts in the region, reached out to an astounding 9 lakh individuals across 12,000+ sessions held in more than 4,200 Panchayats. It aimed to promote awareness about the Holistic Agriculture Development Programme (HADP) and other government schemes designed to uplift the agricultural community in the Union Territory.

This effort, unparalleled in scale and ambition, focused on creating a bridge between farmers and the services available to them, facilitating access to vital resources that can boost agricultural productivity and rural prosperity. One of the cornerstones of this initiative was the Baseline Survey of Farmers, conducted across the region, reaching 7 lakh farmers. The survey aimed to assess the challenges and needs of farmers, gather data, and help tailor future policies and interventions.

- The Scale and Reach of Kisan Sampark Abhiyan
 - The Kisan Sampark Abhiyan's scale was nothing short of historic. By reaching out to over 9 lakh people, this initiative took place in the remotest corners of Jammu and Kashmir, touching lives across both rural and semi-urban areas. Through 12,000+ sessions organized in over 4,200 Panchayats, the program brought together agricultural experts, government officials, and professionals from various agri-allied sectors. These sessions were designed to create direct communication channels with farmers, facilitating better understanding of various government schemes and promoting efficient farming techniques.
 - The Kisan Sampark Abhiyan was carried out in three phases. The first phase was extensive one covering all the schemes under HADP, the second phase was intensive, and the third phase focused on agriculture credit.
 - With the support of over 5000 professionals from diverse fields within agriculture and allied sectors, the program's reach was further strengthened. These experts played a pivotal role in delivering knowledge, answering questions, and guiding farmers through complex topics related to crop management, soil health, irrigation techniques, pest control, and much more. The involvement of such a large pool of professionals ensured that the sessions were not only informative but also practical, addressing real-world challenges faced by farmers.

IV: Kisan Sampark Abhiyan & Baseline Survey: Bridging the Gaps

Raising Awareness about HADP and Government Schemes

At the heart of the Kisan Sampark Abhiyan was the promotion of the Holistic Agriculture Development Programme (HADP), a visionary initiative aimed at transforming the agriculture sector in Jammu and Kashmir. Through the Abhiyan, farmers were educated about the various facets of HADP, which include providing support for innovative farming techniques, the introduction of new crops, financial assistance, and much more.

In addition to HADP, the program also aimed to raise awareness about a wide array of government schemes, which can significantly enhance agricultural productivity and improve the livelihoods of farmers. The sessions highlighted the importance of these schemes, making them accessible to the farmers who need them the most.


A Comprehensive Course Curriculum and Resource Materials

To ensure that the knowledge imparted during the sessions had lasting value, a specialized course curriculum was developed. This curriculum included over 50 high-quality videos covering a range of agricultural topics. These videos were designed to be both educational and easy to understand, empowering farmers with the tools and skills necessary to enhance their agricultural practices.

In addition to the video curriculum, a range of resource materials (booklets) in Urdu, Hindi and English was provided. These materials were tailored to address specific issues faced by farmers in Jammu and Kashmir. From guidance on crop diversification and irrigation to best practices for soil management and pest control, the resources offered practical solutions that could be implemented immediately.

Baseline Survey: Understanding the Farmer's Needs

A major highlight of the Kisan Sampark Abhiyan was the Baseline Survey of Farmers, which formed the backbone of this outreach effort. This survey reached an impressive 7 lakh farmers, gathering critical data on the challenges and needs of the agricultural community in Jammu and Kashmir. By collecting this data, the program provided the government with invaluable insights into the realities faced by farmers. The baseline survey included information on a wide range of factors, such as farmers' access to government schemes, their knowledge of modern farming techniques, their financial conditions, and their overall satisfaction with agricultural services. The survey's results will serve as a foundation for designing future interventions, policies, and support systems that are more targeted and effective in meeting the needs of the farming community.



Competing for Collective Growth District Rankings

The Holistic Agriculture Development Program evaluates and ranks districts monthly based on critical parameters to ensure transparency and continuous improvement. These rankings provide insights into district-level performance and highlight areas of strength and growth opportunities.

- Shopian stands at the **1st position** with strong performance across parameters, especially in application coverage, approvals and fund utilisation.
- Kathua secures **2nd place**, showcasing robust progress in approvals, Daksh kisan completions fund utilisation and KKG user registrations.



Samba demonstrates remarkable improvement, climbing **10 spots** to rank 4th, attributed to increased application approvals and KKG farm registrations.

Key Metrics

Application Coverage & Approvals: Measures how effectively districts engage farmers and process their applications.

Skilling - Daksh Kisan: Evaluates enrollment and completion of skilling programs.

Unit Establishment: Tracks the establishment and fund utilization rates of approved units.

KKG (Kisan Khidmat Ghar): Monitors user registrations and farm registrations through the newly launched farmer service center initiative.

Notable Observations

- Srinagar moved up 7 places in rankings on account of improved fund utilisation and enhancement of unit establishment.
- Anantnag slid back 6 places requiring focus on KKG User registration and increases in application coverage.

Areas for Improvement

• Poonch and Reasi, had maximum downward slide need focused interventions in application scale, skilling enrollments, and fund utilization.

Voices from the Fields Stories of Transformation

The heart of the Holistic Agriculture Development Programme (HADP) lies in its farmers visionaries who embrace change, harness opportunities, and exemplify resilience. In this chapter, we celebrate the voices of those who are driving transformation across Jammu & Kashmir, turning challenges into milestones of success.

Harvesting Prosperity: Bashir Ahmad's Story

Bashir Ahmad, an apple grower from Kashmir, struggled with manual grading—costly, slow, and labor-intensive. Through HADP and Kisan Sampark Abhiyan, he set up a Portable Grading Line on 5th February 2024 with a 50% subsidy of Rs 2.5 lakh.

Now, Bashir processes 25-30 apple boxes per hour, employs 4 people, and earns an additional Rs 40,000-50,000 monthly. With plans to expand to a double-line machine, Bashir's success highlights how modern solutions can transform livelihoods and improve market access.

A Greenhouse of Prosperity: Ram Lal's Journey

Ram Lal, a farmer from Kambal Danga, Udhampur, transitioned from low-yield maize and wheat farming to high-value crops with HADP's 95% subsidy. By setting up a hi-tech poly greenhouse and receiving expert technical support, Ram Lal now produces 50 quintal vegetables per cycle, earning a stable additional ₹40,000-50,000 monthly. This transformation has ensured year-round cultivation, improved water efficiency, and strengthened the local supply of fresh produce, turning Ram Lal into a model farmer in his community.

A Dairy Dream Realized: Ameena Akhter's Success Story

Ameena Akhter, a determined entrepreneur from Khiram Dargah, Bijbehara, Anantnag, turned her passion for dairy farming into a thriving business with the help of a 100% subsidy from HADP. With an investment of ₹4.82 lakh, she set up a milk processing unit capable of processing 36,000 liters of milk annually. This venture not only generated an additional ₹3.5–4 lakh in income but also created stable employment for three individuals in her community. Ameena's dairy business has significantly boosted her livelihood, offering year-round income stability.
